- 4. Playground Extension: Successfully completed, providing enhanced recreational facilities for students.


Conclusion:

- Looking Ahead: We anticipate further collaborations and initiatives to enhance our educational offerings and community involvement in the coming months.














28th August Visit from Jullay Partarge







